Minutes of the Public Meeting held on May 21, 2014

Mr. Albano, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:33 p.m.

1. Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Albano led the Pledge of Allegiance and requested a moment of silence for our service men and women in harm's way.

Mr. Rudolph commended the Chair on the way he conducts the meetings in regards to the moment of silence being done after the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Albano instructed Executive Director Zeuner to check with law enforcement in regards to security at our facilities in light of recent news reports of terrorist/criminal attacks against public utilities.

2. Executive Directors Report

Executive Director Zeuner provided an overview of agenda items before the Board this evening:

PA DEP HAZARDOUS SITES CLEAN-UP ACT (HSCA) CHURCHVILLE TCE SITE:

On May 7, 2014 the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental conducted a public hearing at the Northampton Township administrative building regarding this subject. There are three (3) alternatives are under consideration: 1. Do nothing 2. Provide Carbon filters to the property owners 3. Provide public water (fully funded by a grant). There are nineteen (19) properties currently in the program: Twelve (12) are located in Northampton Township and seven (7) located in Upper Southampton Township. Public comment will remain open with the DEP until June 20, 2014 after which time a decision will be made by the Department. A final decision should occur during the summer. Once notification is

provided, the project must be completed within one (1) year. Northampton Township would be given the grant.

CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT / NEWSLETTER: Mr. Zeuner stated that the CCR (Consumer Confidence Report) and newsletter "The Authority" are being combined this year in an effort to hold down costs. Pennoni Associates has complete the data required for publication of the CCR report. The newsletter segment will consist of four (4) articles: Sump Pumps and the Sanitary Sewer System, The new Authority website, Green Energy and MuniciPAY on-line payment and credit card services. The newsletter will be sent to customers by the end of June as required.

SPRING HYDRANT FLUSHING: The Spring Hydrant Flushing program was completed without incident. Mr. Zeuner noted that due to weather conditions during the period, maintenance personnel were challenged to maintain the schedule due to the rain.

BCWSA WATER SUPPLY: Mr. Zeuner stated that the conversion from water supply via the BCWSA connection (Philadelphia to Forrest Park) is nearing completion. Earlier this month we were asked to curtail acquisition of water via the connection for a period of 2 days to enable contractors to install large regulating valves in the system. The Authority complied with the request by filling all above ground storage tanks to their maximum capacity and increasing the draw from our fifteen (15) municipal wells by our system control and data acquisition equipment (SCADA). The period was without incident or reduction in available capacities to our customers

NEW WEBSITE: The Bergey Creative Group is nearing completion of the new Authority website. It is our expectation that launch of the site will occur in June 2014

WOODS PUMP STATION: Planning and permitting is moving forward with the Woods pump station upgrade and redirection of force main to a splitter chamber. Mr. Walker has the documents from the contractor which are being reviewed for bid preparation.

PENNBID: Mr. Zeuner stated that the bids for capital project CP-S-A-14 (CIPP LINING) and CP-03-S-A-14 (MANHOLE REHABILITATION) were opened via the electronic bidding system PENNBID. It is our expectation that the bid tabulation and recommendation can be presented at the next Authority public meeting in June for board consideration.

Capital Project Cp-16-14: Paving Contract for the Authority Office back, well 6, and Highspire Pump Station.
