Minutes of the Public Meeting held on November 04, 2015

Mr. Farling, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:34 p.m.

1. Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Farling led the Pledge of Allegiance and requested a moment of silence for our service men and women in harm's way.

Chairman Farling stated that the Board met in executive session to discuss matters of potential litigation.

2. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Zeuner reviewed the items on the agenda and stated that the annual audit has begun led by B. Bergvall.

3. Citizens' Concerns

No citizens wished to address the Board.

4. Approval of the Minutes of October 7, 2015

A motion (Jim-Deon) made to approve the Minutes of October 7, 2015 passed with 4 ayes, Ms. Held abstained.

5. Check Requisitions / Accounts Payable

A motion (Held-Jim) adopting a resolution to approve **Revenue Fund Requisition No. 2067** dated October 21, 2015 in the amount of \$340,000.00 passed with 5 ayes.

The major items paid under **Requisition No. 2067** are as follows: BCWSA -Sewer \$246,990.64; BCWSA - Water - \$187,411.20; Ebert Engineering - \$4,108.17; Independence Blue Cross - \$26,423.14; Line Systems Inc. - \$1,067.97; Maxsolar Energy LLC - \$1,398.43; NSM Insurance Group - \$29,690.00; Michael Perzel - \$4,302.70; Pace Analytical - \$6,405.00; PECO - \$8,730.19; Pennoni Assoc. - \$53,746.56; Southampton Post Office - \$5,000.00; Telog - \$1,800.00 Yanora Enterprises - \$1,550.00; and a \$70,000.00 transfer for payroll and \$38,756.51 transfer for BCWSA disputed.

A motion (Held-Farling) adopting a resolution to approve **Revenue Fund Requisition No. 2068** dated November 4, 2015 in the amount of \$236,975.34 passed with 5 ayes.

The major items paid under **Requisition No. 2068** are as follows: All Industrial Safety Products \$1,761.84; CorrPro - \$3,390.00; Custom Care Property - \$1,950.00; Ebert Engineering - \$6,526.98; Guardian - \$3,309.72; Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc. - \$5,323.34; Link Computer Corp. - \$3,280.00; PECO - \$2,560.49; Rudolph Clarke - \$23,050.14; W. Bruce Beaton - \$103,023.00; Ellen Distefano \$3,000.00 and a \$70,000.00 transfer for payroll.

A motion (Held-Jim) adopting a resolution to approve **BRI Fund Requisition No. 553** dated September 30, 2015 in the amount of 46,463.52 passed with 5 ayes.

A motion (Held-Deon) adopting a resolution to approve **BRI Fund Requisition No. 554** dated October 21, 2015 in the amount of 328,126.40 passed with 5 ayes.

A motion (Held-Rehm) adopting a resolution to approve **BRI Fund Requisition No. 555** dated November 4, 2015 in the amount of 53,750.05 passed with 5 ayes.

6. Amendment to Corrective Action Plan (CAP)

A motion (Rehm-Deon) made to adopt the amended Connection Management Plan (CMP) dated October 1, 2015 provided by Northampton Township as a revision to the exhibit in the Authority's Corrective Action Plan (CAP) last revised July 1, 2015. I further instruct the Executive Director to notify BCWSA and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection of the amendment to its' official CAP and Chapter 94 Report passed with 5 ayes.

7. 2016 Operational and Capital Budget Adoption

A motion (Deon-Rehm) made to adopt the 2016 Operational Budget as presented and approve the 2016 Capital budget Schedule "A" only passed with 5 ayes.

8. Thomas Zeuner – Performance Bonus

Chairman Farling read the following statement:

2015 has been another productive year for this Authority. During the last fiscal year, Mr. Zeuner has guided the organization through the Muni-Link/QuickBooks conversion and implementation: I have lived several of these in my own experience. Systems touch virtually every aspect of the business. The planning before, the data checking during, and the learning curve for all users after the conversion are all difficult, stressful, and require intensive care throughout. Mr. Zeuner has managed to the transition and the inevitable minor bumps along the way smoothly and professionally.

Mr. Zeuner has prudently but unflinchingly asserted and protected the rights of the Authority and its ratepayers in several very financially significant instances. The Authority has engaged professionals to gather relevant facts, and Mr. Zeuner has made determinations about the way forward based on a fair and reasoned view of those facts and the underlying agreements; and stood firm in the face of substantial pressures.

Mr. Zeuner worked with his team to develop a Corrective Action Plan with clear goals and deadlines, and measures of actual performance. The plan not only meets all regulatory

requirements, but has the added benefit of being physically achievable, in contrast to other options presented to the Authority.

Forward thinking: The G.I.S. and emergency response systems, and the I & I task force established this year are three significant ongoing projects expected to substantially benefit the Authority and the ratepayers, but are not considered tonight because they will not be complete until some point in 2016 fiscal year and beyond. Very substantial portions of the agenda tonight and in the next months are about the future: the budget tonight and the updated 5 year plan next month. Tom continues to think and plan ahead; to anticipate rather than react.

For these and other contributions, I therefore make a motion to award Mr. Zeuner a performance bonus for the fiscal year in the amount of \$5000.00. Mr. Jim seconded, the motion passed with 4 ayes, Ms. Held abstained.

9. C.I.P.P. (Cured in Place Pipe) Change Order No. 1

A motion (Jim-Farling) made to approve Change Order No. 1 for Contract 1-S-A-15 for C.I.P.P. lining to provide for bypass pumping in the amount of \$3,478.87 passed with 5 ayes.

10. Traffic Control Agreement

A motion (Rehm-Jim) made to authorize the Executive Director to engage Flagger Force Traffic Control Services of Hummelstown, PA on an as needed basis in accordance with their prevailing rate sheet.

11. Leehurst Farm LP Land Development/Bond Reduction

A motion (Jim-Rehm) made to authorize the reduction in its Bond identified as #39BSBGP4941 in the amount of \$731,406.25, and further authorize a reduction in its Bond #39BSBGP4936 in the amount of \$238,322.36 in accordance with the review letter of October 26, 2015 by Pennoni Associates passed with 5 ayes.

12. PNOL Pinnacle Estates - Feasibility Review

A motion (Farling-Rehm) made to declare public water and public sanitary sewer feasible for the 7 lot subdivision known as Pinnacle Estates passed with 5 ayes.

13. Engagement of Professional Services - Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc.

A motion (Deon-Farling) made that the Northampton, Bucks County, Municipal Authority Board approve the engagement of Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc. of Harrisburg, Pa for the purpose of providing the Authority with 'Water and Wastewater Rate Studies' in accordance with their proposal dated November 3, 2015, consisting of 6 pages passed with 5 ayes.

BOARD COMMENTS

Mr. Deon voiced concerns regarding political pieces that included information taken from Authority executive sessions. Executive sessions are set up to protect the ratepayers. He stated that the Board must have confidence that what is said in executive session shall remain confidential.

Mr. Walker thanked the Board for trusting him with the G.I.S. project and is excited to present the project to the Board at the December meeting.
