4. Approval of the Minutes of June 3, 2015

A motion (Jim-Farling) made to approve the Minutes of June 3, 2015 passed with 4 ayes.

5. Check Requisitions / Accounts Payable

A motion (Held-Jim) adopting a resolution to approve **Revenue Fund Requisition No. 2058** dated June 17, 2015 in the amount of \$113,093.92 passed with 4 ayes.

A motion (Jim-Rehm) made that the Northampton, Bucks County, Municipal Authority Board approve the Municipal Wasteload Management Corrective Action Plan (CAP) for the Neshaminy Interceptor Basis last revised July 1, 2015 and further move that the document be submitted to Northampton Township and BCWSA as this Authority's adopted Corrective Action Plan (CAP) passed with 4 ayes.

A motion (Jim-Rehm) made that the Northampton, Bucks County, Municipal Authority submit the Adopted Correction Action Plan (CAP) for the Neshaminy Interceptor Basin dated July 1, 2015 to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection as an amendment to its' 2014 submittal of the Chapter 94 Report passed with 4 ayes.

A motion (Jim-Farling) made that the Northampton, Bucks County, Municipal Authority approve the draft letter authored by the Authority's Environmental Counsel Jonathan Rinde of Manko, Gold, Katcher & Fox dated July 1, 2015 to Bucks County Water and Sewer Authority's Environmental Counsel providing clarification to outstanding issues related to the Neshaminy Interceptor evaluation passed with 4 ayes.

7. Well Pump Replacement (Well 9) - Contract Award

A motion (Rehm-Jim) made that the Northampton, Bucks County, Municipal Authority Board award the well pump and motor replacement for Well #9 to F.L. Bollinger & Son in the amount of \$13,330.00 in accordance with their proposal dated June 15, 2015 passed with 4 ayes.

8. Water Project Construction and Assignment Agreement - TCE Project

A motion (Jim-Farling) made that the Northampton, Bucks County, Municipal Authority Board award Contract #4-S-15 for the Highspire Comminutor to the lowest responsive bidder, Blooming Glen Contractors in the amount of \$57,262.00 passed with 4 ayes.

12. Extension Request/Grouting Contract 3-S-A-15

A motion (Farling-Rehm) made that the Northampton, Bucks County, Municipal Authority Board grant the requested extension of time to Video Pipe Services of Newfield NJ, Contract # 3-S-A-15 amending the end of the work completion date for work areas 100, 200, and 300 to August 11, 2015 passed with 4 ayes.

ENGINEER COMMENTS

Christopher Walker - Pennoni Assoc. - Upgrades on the Woods Pump Station by Toll Brothers contractor MGK started on Monday using 2 bypass pumps, and should be completed by the middle of August. CVA, also a contractor for Toll Brothers is doing site work and the sanitary sewer extension from Virginia Drive to Hatboro Road, we do not have a schedule from CVA but pump station work can't be fully tested until CVA has completed their off-site sanitary sewer work. Onsite work at Leehurst sanitary sewer is 100% installed and the water system is about 40% installed with all testing needing to be done. C.I.P.P. and Root Control Contracts will have pre-construction meetings in the next week or so. On the Manhole Project there were 4 manholes lined two weeks ago and that project is completed. Churchville TCE project is being done at night and progressing well.
